## COLLEGE ADMISSION SESSIONS

### To attend a college visit day:

1. Stop by the Burris Counseling Center
2. Sign up on the clipboard for which college visits you want to attend
3. Ask the Counseling Center front desk worker for a College Visit Pass
4. Give the pass to your teacher at least a day ahead of time, and ask what work you will need to make up from your absence
5. Attend the College Visit – the visits are in Wagner Hall (the Indiana Academy building), which is between Burris and the Student Center. Buzz in to their front office and ask for Mrs. Workman. She will walk you to the Sally Conference Center where the college visits will all take place.
6. Smile that you are one step closer to achieving your college dream
