About the Program

Our Dual Credit Program enables your high-ability, college-bound juniors and seniors to take classes that qualify for both high school and college credit.

All courses apply to Ball State University's bachelor's degree programs, plus most courses transfer to other Indiana colleges and universities.

How it Works

Your students have two ways to participate:

- **Courses Are Taught At Your High School** — These courses are taught on site at your high school by your high school teachers who are approved as adjunct instructors by Ball State. These courses meet both your high school requirements and provide additional instruction to satisfy collegiate standards.
- **Your High School Students Take Courses Online** — If your school doesn't offer the dual credit courses that your students need, they can take courses online that are taught by Ball State faculty.

Ball State University was founded in 1918 and is located in Muncie, Indiana, 55 miles northeast of Indianapolis.
